Car: Just a few minutes' drive from junction 13 and 14 of the M1. Follow the signs to Bletchley Park then head up the hill to us where you can enjoy **FREE parking!**

Sat Nav: MK3 6DS



Rail: Frequent services from London and Birmingham to Bletchley. Simply turn right on exit of the station and take the short walk to the museum.



Buses: There are buses from all areas arriving at Bletchley bus station. On leaving the station, head towards the railway station and carry on to Bletchley Park.

About the Museum

The National Museum of Computing at Bletchley Park is the largest dedicated computer museum in the UK and ranks amongst the top three in the world. The National Museum of Computing enables visitors to follow the development of computing from the ultra-secret pioneering efforts of the 1940s through the large systems and mainframes of the 1950s, 60s and 70s, and the rise of personal computing in the 1980s and beyond.

Highlights of early computing include the rebuild of Colossus, the world's first electronic computer and the Harwell Dekatron aka WITCH, the world's oldest working digital computer.

There are lots of hands-on opportunities which showcase the desktop computing revolution with machines from the late 1970s and 1980s. The bank of BBC Micro Computers in the Classroom is nostalgic for many and great fun for young would-be coders.

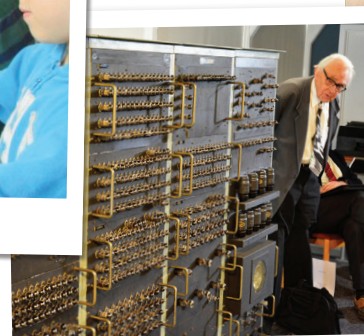
Opening Times
